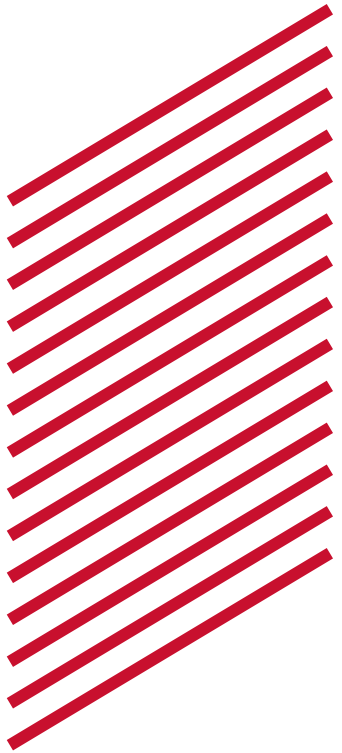

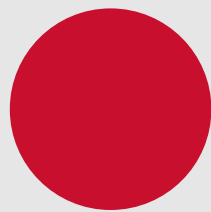

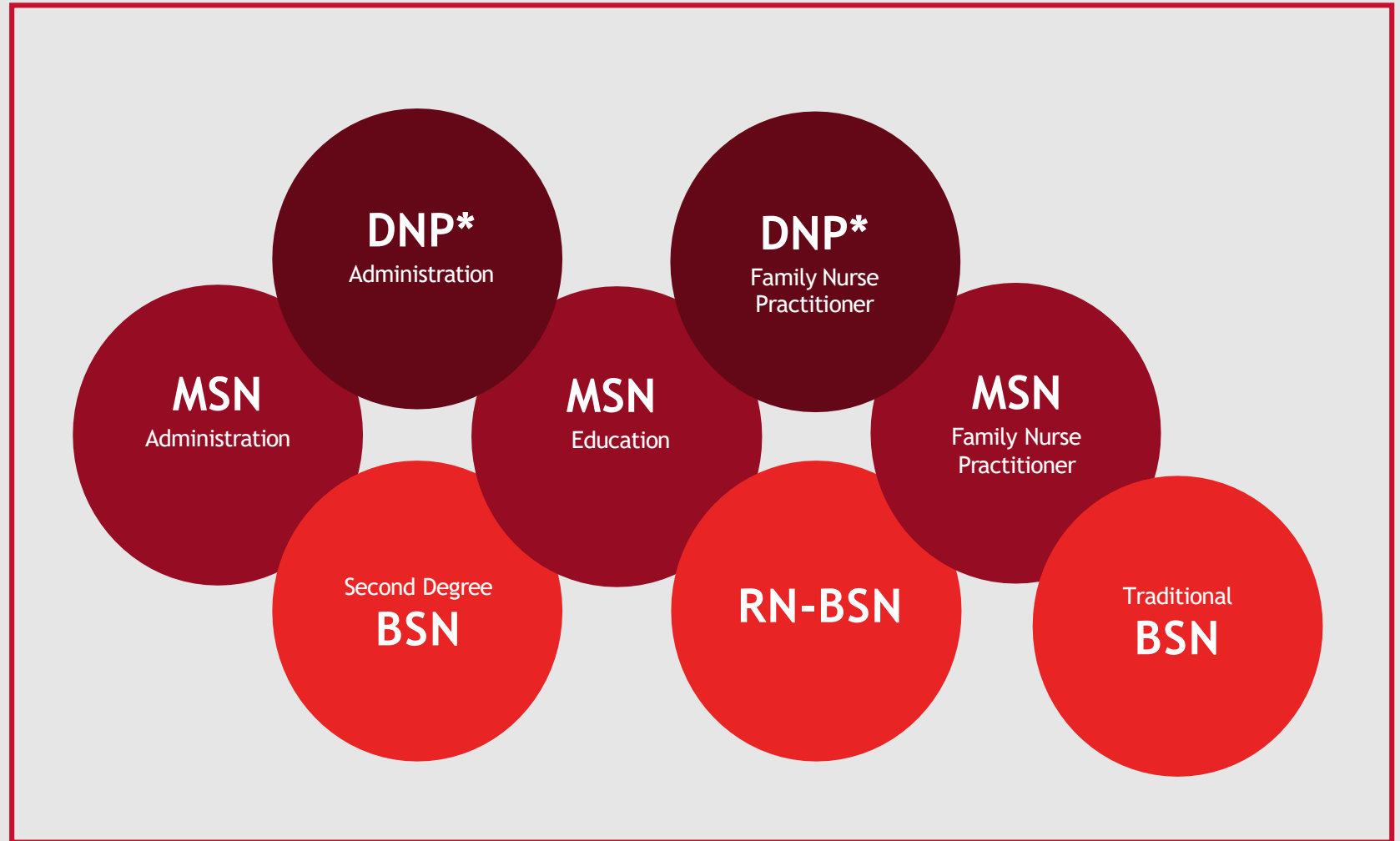

RN to BSN



The RN to BSN track is offered at the University of Houston at Sugar Land, University of Houston at Katy, and face-to-face/web-enhanced classes or hybrid/online. The track is designed to work around your busy schedule. You'll receive a Tier One university education from excellent faculty at a great value. Lab and/or clinical course requirements will be in a face-to-face learning environment for practice and demonstration to meet course objectives and accreditation requirements. Our innovative RN to BSN program will allow you to advance your career by completing your BSN degree. Finish the program in as little as a year.

Second Degree BSN

The Second Degree BSN track is offered face-to-face at the University of Houston at Sugar Land. Admission to this fast track is every Spring semester. It is twelve-months long, intensive and full-time for people holding bachelor's or master's degrees in other fields who want to become registered nurses (RNs). This accelerated track is designed to facilitate a career change for the more mature and experienced student. Admission to this program is every Spring. **The deadline for application is August 1.**

Pre – Nursing

First-time-in-college degree seeking students are not directly admitted into Nursing as a major but must apply to the College of Nursing [Pre-Nursing pathway](#) as their intended course of study through the University of Houston undergraduate admissions application process.

For admission rules and requirements applicable to all University of Houston applicants visit UH Admissions.

The admission standards for Pre-Nursing are more rigorous than the general admission criteria for UH. Pre-Nursing UH Students who wish to apply to Nursing must meet additional criteria and be accepted through a highly competitive admission process:

Admission Criteria

To declare Pre-Nursing as an intended course of study, high school graduates must meet the following criteria.

Class Rank		Total SAT Score/ Min. SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing (ERW)		ACT Composite/ Min. ACT English
Top 25%	AND	1270/630	OR	27/24
26%-50%		1320/630		28/24
All Others/ Not Ranked		1400/630		32/24

In addition, applicants for Pre-Nursing must complete the following high school coursework:

- English: 4 units
- Biology, Chemistry, and 2 other advanced science courses requiring biology and chemistry as pre-requisites: 4 units
- Algebra: 2 units
- Geometry: 1 unit
- Pre-Calculus or other advanced math (i.e., statistics): 1 unit

Traditional BSN Track

The Traditional BSN Track is designed for University of Houston students who want to apply to the nursing major beginning their junior year to become a registered nurse (RN). The freshman and sophomore years will be at the University of Houston. After gaining admission in the nursing program, the junior and senior years will be taught face-to-face at the [University of Houston at Katy](#) instructional site.



Master of Science in Nursing

The Master of Science in Nursing program (Education, Administration, and Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP)) is designed to build upon the BSN degree and is offered at the University of Houston at Katy and online. Students in this program are prepared to function at advanced levels with an expanded knowledge of theory, research and clinical application. Graduates are prepared to provide evidenced based health care and to work on collaborative teams. Lab and/or clinical course requirements will be in a face-to-face learning environment for practice and demonstration to meet course objectives and accreditation requirements.

Each graduate will be able to function in an advanced practice role as a **Nurse Administrator, Nurse Educator, or Family Nurse Practitioner.**

Nurses who have a master's degree in nursing may be eligible for a Post Master's Certificate as a nurse educator or nurse administrator.



MSN Administration

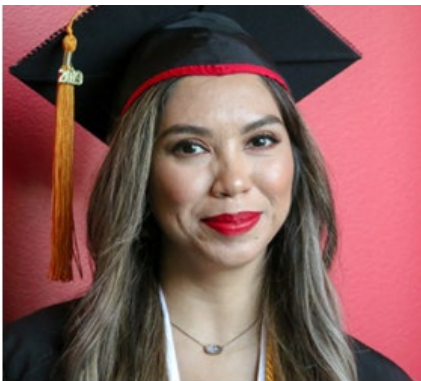
The Administration track prepares students to lead healthcare innovations by improving access, addressing quality and safety issues, and supervising the finance and operations of a health care organization.

MSN Education

Through the Education track, nurse educators prepare to apply educational theory and practice, develop courses and curriculum for nursing students and staff, and develop classroom and clinical strategies to prepare nurses to function in the health care environment.

Family Nurse Practitioner

The FNP track integrates both academic and community-based training to promote an evidence based approach to the care of individuals, families and the community. Hybrid graduate tracks offer face-to-face classes one day a week for maximum scheduling flexibility for students, while offering the essential benefit of role-modeling and networking with leaders in the profession.



Doctor of Nursing Practice

The DNP program is offered in a hybrid delivery model utilizing both online and face-to-face modalities two days per term at the University of Houston campus. Additionally, clinical experiences will be available face-to-face in the community setting.

The DNP program is a full or part time, post master's program designed for working nurses utilizing a hybrid (partially face-to-face and online) delivery method. Students may choose between two options: PM FNP- DNP or PM Administration - DNP. The PM FNP- DNP track and the PM Administration - DNP track will be delivered predominantly in an online format with face-to-face experiences especially in clinical settings.



DNP Overview

- Has two tracks (Administration, Family Nurse Practitioner) and builds upon the MSN degree
- Is an evidence-based-practice-focused program
- Nurses who have a Doctor of Nursing Practice have completed the highest level of education in nursing practice
- Deadline to apply is April 1
- Admittance is once a year and will be every Fall
- Must have a minimum 3.0 GPA in your cumulative (all) course work
- The courses are mainly offered online with students attending courses face-to-face twice a semester for a maximum of two days each meeting
- Face-to-face meetings will take place at the UH Main campus

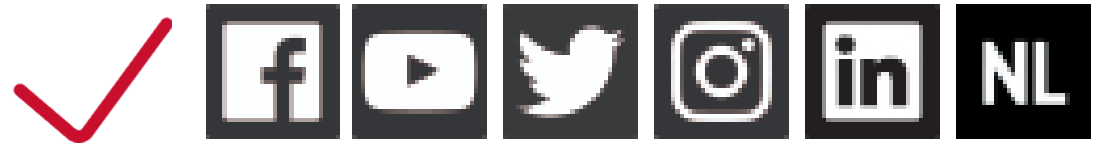
